BRIEF INTRODUCTION OF THE EVENT

On July 27, 2024, the Entrepreneurship Cell (E-Cell) of Jadavpur University organized a successful community outreach event titled "Organizing Innovation & Entrepreneurship Outreach Program in School/Community" at **Chak Chaitonno Prathamik Vidyalaya**, Jalangi, Murshidabad. This event was part of E-Cell's ongoing efforts to foster innovation and entrepreneurial thinking at the grassroots level, particularly in rural areas, by inspiring young minds to embrace creativity, problem-solving, and entrepreneurship from an early age.

The primary goal of the program was to introduce school students and the local community to the fundamentals of entrepreneurship, leadership, and innovation. Through engaging activities and interactive discussions, the event sought to empower the participants, helping them understand how innovative thinking can solve real-world problems and create opportunities for economic growth.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Welcome Address and Introduction to the Program:

The event kicked off with a warm welcome to all participants, including school students, teachers, and local community members. The principal of Chak Chaitonno Prathamik Vidyalaya opened the program with a heartfelt message about the importance of education and entrepreneurship in shaping the future of the younger generation, especially in rural areas.

Our representative gave a brief introduction to the concept of entrepreneurship, explaining how it is not only about starting businesses but also about cultivating a mindset that seeks innovative solutions to everyday problems. The audience was enthusiastic, with many students eager to learn about how innovation could help improve their local community.

Interactive Session on Innovation and Creativity

We explained the importance of entrepreneurial skills such as leadership, teamwork, and problem-solving, encouraging them to think about how they can apply these skills to benefit their community.

Hands-On Activity: Mini Business Plan Competition

One of the most engaging parts of the event was a **Mini Business Plan Competition**. Students were divided into small teams and given the task of creating a simple business plan for a product or service they could start within their community. With guidance from E-Cell members, they brainstormed ideas, calculated costs, and discussed how they could market their products or services to potential customers.

The enthusiasm and creativity shown by the students were outstanding. Ideas ranged from selling eco-friendly handmade products to starting a local tutoring service for younger children. Each group presented their business plans, and the best plans were recognized with small prizes, encouraging the students to further explore entrepreneurship as a viable path in the future.

Community Engagement and Feedback

The local community, including parents and teachers, was actively involved in the program. We held a session where community members shared their concerns and ideas on how entrepreneurship could help improve local economic conditions. The discussion covered issues such as job creation, sustainable practices, and leveraging local resources like agriculture and handicrafts.

Feedback from the community was overwhelmingly positive. The teachers appreciated the focus on practical learning and encouraged the E-Cell to organize similar events in the future to help build an entrepreneurial culture among the younger generation.
